## **Our National Dignity**

Our national dignity demands, in the liberated areas, more of us than some seem to realize. We must draw attention to a course of action that has also been written elsewhere. Because it violates our national dignity.

It is the attitude of many girls. Naturally the troops who liberated us have every right to our gratitude and appreciation.

This can be demonstrated by cordial welcoming attitude, such as that from person to person. The woman will be able to do this with her own charm and appearance. But it is completely superfluous and incorrect to let go and to arrive at the more intimate relationship that is characteristic of the intimate relationship between woman and man.

It is not for our women to take over the role of English women and girls. They have reserved to behave, even where there is every reason for gratitude, and appreciation. This demands the Christian doctrine to which our people confess. This also demands our national dignity. We are obliged to honor these values towards this nation, and to preserve as much as possible our people's welfare, which includes our physical and mental health. The Dutch people has to remain Dutch, and must not become a mixed population of Dutch, Germans, English, Americans, Canadians ...
